At a few prisons schools are established; but at several no instruction is given to juvenile offenders in either reading or writing. The treatment of the sick differs materially. At many gaols, a surgeon attends only when sent for; at some he visits twice a week, and at others daily. Several prisons are still without any infirmary, or suitable rooms for the separation of the sick. Further measures are therefore indispensable to insure obedience to the law.
